rotational basis. Stipend for
hosting club (\$100)

Intermediate (Local)

Main Focus: Training session.
Core set of Sensei' hosting &
sharing. Class & individual
teaching

Venue: Hosted at local clubs on a
rotating basis, every other month,
free for WJI members. Stipend for
hosting club (\$200)

- Building upon concepts, ukemi,
techniques, movement, advancing
kuzushi
- Zones of fighting
- Technique setup & entries
- Gripping solutions
- Influencing/controlling opponent's
movement

Advanced (State)

Main Focus: Tournament Judo
play through interclub & training.
Guest clinicians for 1) athletes, 2)
coaches' clinics

Venue: Hosted at local clubs on a
rotating basis, 2-per year, free for
WJI members. Stipend for hosting
club (\$200)

- Building upon concepts, ukemi,
techniques, movement, advancing
kuzushi
- Perfecting upon concepts,
techniques, movement, kuzushi
- Participate in Interclub sessions
- Develop list of WJI coaches and
national players and their specialty;
allow students to seek them out.

National

Main Focus: National level
tournaments and clinics support
for WJI member athletes

Criteria: National potential
competitor who consistently place
at state & regional tournaments.
Core Sensei group is responsible
for selecting those who qualify.
Athlete participation in this full
development program is required
to be eligible for sponsorships
